### The Walled Gardens, Moreton

In 1744-5 James Frampton built the present Moreton House, replacing a Jacobean House that had been close to the church. At the beginning of World War 2 the House was taken over as accommodation for the Air Force personnel from Warmwell Aerodrome. Later it was prepared as a hospital for casualties from the D-day landings but in the event it was not needed. After the war the house was let until 1956 when Roger Frampton retired and was able to move back into the family home.

The garden walls and the octagonal shaped 'bothy' (Plant Sales room) were built in 1742. The gardens were originally laid out in an E-shape, always open on the long south side. The 'bothy' is at the middle of the E. It was built as a garden house where the young gardener would have been lodged. A matching building which stood at the far end of the E near the manor House was built as a dovecote, but is now sadly ruined.

The gardens are divided into two, comprising of; the ornamental gardens, which is about three acres in size and used to be the ornamental garden for Moreton House; and the kitchen garden which is an area of about two acres and used to contain vegetables, fruit trees, greenhouses and cold frames.
